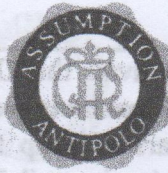

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Greetings!

You may have noticed the increase in incidence of diseases this past month of September. We would like to encourage everyone to be involved in preventing these diseases.

First, an update on DENGUE. It is good news that we only have 11 confirmed cases of dengue fever as of September 30, 2019. As precautionary measures against Dengue mosquitoes, the school's General Services staff sprays mosquito repellent (Brand name Fendona® and Spectra®*) twice a day: once before the girls arrive and again in the afternoon after everyone has left. Also, the school hires a third party service provider who does the quarterly spraying of mosquito repellent using Spectra®, the latest done August 16, 2019.

We would like to encourage everyone to be pro-active in the fight against Dengue Fever. Please be informed again that your daughters may now come to school in proper Dengue attire. It consists of white long-sleeved shirt with a school patch on the left chest and PE jogging pants or any dark-colored jogging pants for uniformity and adequate coverage. The white long-sleeved shirts are available in the school bookstore. A pair of socks, preferably long, is also advised to be worn.

Second, in light of the recent occurrence of POLIO and DIPHTHERIA cases in our country, we would like to remind you to verify if your child is up to date with her vaccinations. All students 4 years old and above are expected to have received their booster for polio and diphtheria (usually combined with tetanus and pertussis). For students younger than 4 years old, please discuss with your pediatrician the option to accelerate their schedule for the above vaccines.

It is also highly recommended that you avail the ORAL POLIO VACCINE currently distributed for free by the Department of Health via a door-to-door campaign and/or at your health center. Children less than 5 years old (up to 59 months) are eligible to receive supplemental vaccination. More information is available at your local government unit.


Lastly, we are also seeing an increase in cases of the common FLU, as well as viral COUGH and COLDS. We advise you to seek early consultation when symptoms like fever, abdominal pains, vomiting, headaches, rashes, and bleeding are observed. May we also request that if your daughter had fever the previous night, please do not allow her to go to school the next day so that she can rest adequately and be further observed at home and/or be brought to her attending pediatrician.


Rest assured that the school is doing everything it can to provide a healthy and safe environment for your daughters. We are grateful for your involvement and support in this endeavor.

IMPORTANT: If your daughter has been absent for 3 days or more due to a medical condition, she is required to present a medical certificate to her class adviser first thing in the morning so that she can be sent immediately to the school clinic for clearance. A medical certificate is especially required if she has been confined in the hospital or if she had suffered from an infectious disease. Strict compliance will be implemented regarding this matter. We respectfully solicit for your cooperation.




